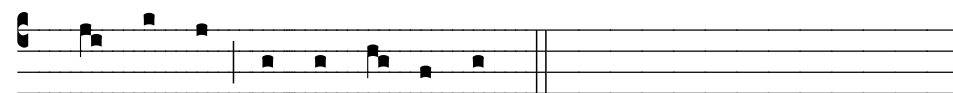

Profession of Faith
