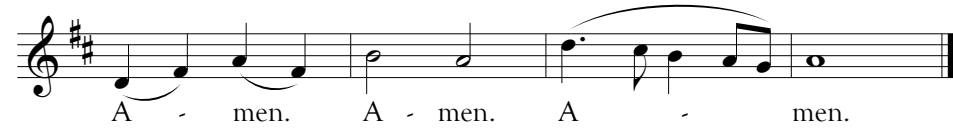
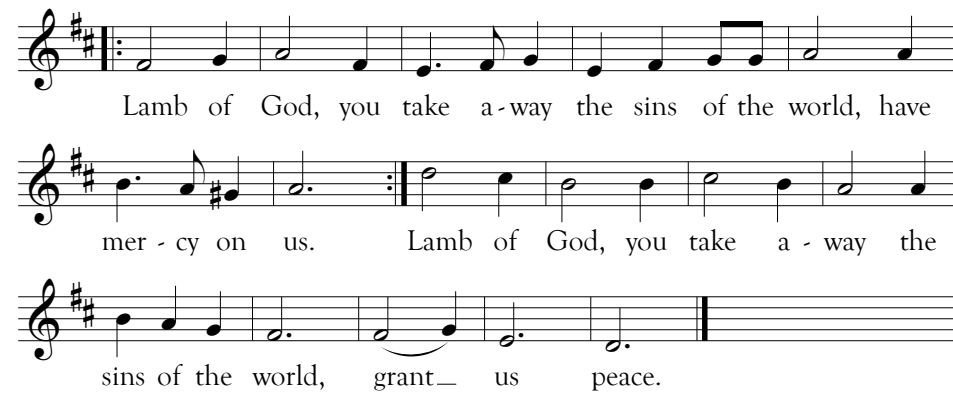

Profession of Faith
