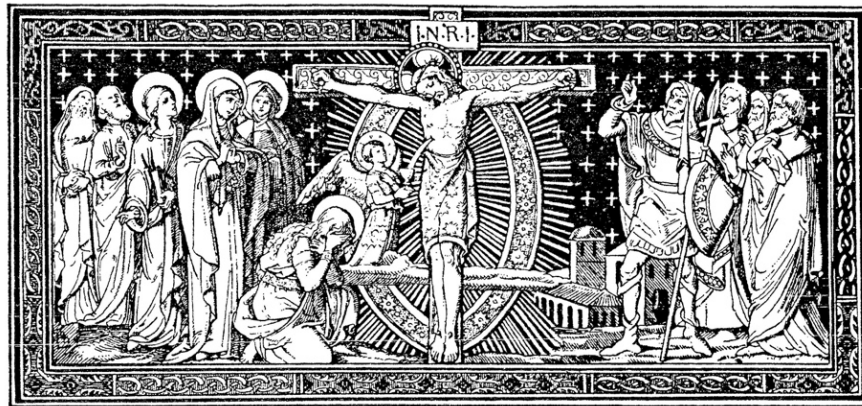

In addition, Dr. Fitzgerald was a semi-finalist in the 2021 National Competition in Organ Improvisation sponsored by the American Guild of Organists.
